Fake News, Internet Rumor, and The Onion

We've all been hearing a lot about "fake news" these days, but misinformation on the Internet is nothing new. Back in the early 2000s we worried about bogus email chains and Internet urban rumors. These days, we have new names for untrue content. No matter what you call it, all content deserves a critical eye. Before you start believing *The Onion*, take a minute to look at source with a few easy steps:

Read it: In a recent study conducted by a group of computer scientists researchers found that 60% of the time readers comment or share Facebook stories without opening the link to the full story. Best way to combat fake news? Read the story itself! A little critical thinking about content is often enough to find the fake.

<u>Verify it:</u> Spend some time looking to verify any numbers, quotes, or stated facts in stories. You can do your own research, or use a reputable site like **FactCheck.org** to find out the rumor and the not-quite true in many kinds of online stories.

<u>Date it:</u> Just because something was true in 2013 doesn't mean it's true now. In the up-to-the minute world of social media we don't train our eyes to look for dates on stories, but a date can tell you a lot. Forwarded alerts on Facebook from 2 years ago are a good indicator and should remind us all to be more critical consumers of information.
